## 2021 Annual Day of Reflection

The Brown County Ursuline Companions presented a prayer opportunity video on November 6th, 2021, as our annual Day of Reflection. The Franciscan Renewal center of Scottsdale, Arizona helped us put together a Taize Prayer chanting designed to bring more peace to our hearts.

### Taizé Prayer Around the Cross

is held in the church on Wednesdays at 7 pm and live streamed on <a href="https://www.youtube.com/thecasafrc">https://www.youtube.com/thecasafrc</a>. Taizé prayer consists of meditative singing, Scripture readings, and periods of silence in order to reach a contemplative state. This style of prayer emerged from an ecumenical community in Taizé, France. Short chants, repeated over and over, give a meditative character. Using just a few words, the chants express a basic reality of faith, quickly grasped by the mind. As the words are sung many times, this reality gradually penetrates the whole being. All are welcome to come and join in this contemplative prayer. This service lasts approximately 35 minutes.

St. Angela Merici Foundress of the Ursulines (1474-1540)

St. Angela Merici, Foundress of the Company of St. Ursula (1474-1540). Angela was born in Lombardy and orphaned at an early age. She became a Franciscan tertiary. She had a vision one day in which she beheld a company of angels and maidens descending from a ladder in the heavens. A voice revealed that she would found a community as large as the ones in her vision. To develop this new life, Angela drew upon her experiences intersecting with God's grace over many years. With other women who joined her they consecrated themselves to God's service in the world and chose as their patron St. Ursula, a legendary 4th century martyr venerated as protector of women. As consecrated virgins they continued to live with their families or together. By the time of her death on Jan. 27th, 1540, Angela was revered as a living saint in Brescia. She was canonized in 1807. Here is a quote: "Strive to be faithful to that which God has called you."

On the day this program was taped the subject was "If you ask me..." This one hour a week writing session has given inmates a vehicle to freely express themselves, therapeutic in many ways.

We have a leader who prayerfully presents a subject for us to ponder and write about, until time is called. We can then share our written 'thoughts with the group.
